



Panel Hanging Tips and Links


Situation 1: Hang panels on a wall (INDOORS)

Use any conventional picture-hanging system, or hooks/screws/nails in the wall to hang from each corner, spaced at approximately 24". You may hang panels by...

- hooking the mesh under the Velcro directly onto a hook, nail or screw.
- screwing into the Velcro (generally only necessary if hanging multiple panels vertically)
- using the provided "S" hooks
- looping 6- to 8-inch zipties ("clear" with light walls; black with dark walls) through the mesh to hang on hooks, bars, nails, etc. Use a level/measuring tape, then cut ziptie tails.
- cutting strips of lattice or trim lumber, attaching sticky Velcro with additional hot glue and staple gun, then hanging or screwing this wooden strip.

Situation 2: Free-standing Installation (INDOORS)

For Exhibition Hall, Conference Center, Church or Municipal Meeting Room, School Auditorium, etc.



Panels (1-5 panels/backdrop), table(s) with coverings, panel or signage on garment rack, and free-standing signage on acrylic pop-ups on the table(s)

Photography Backdrop Stand with tented legs (click for source)


- display up to 8-10 panels as a backdrop without screwing into walls
- For indoor situations only (without wind)
- Adjustable height: 6.5'-8' h
- Adjustable width: 5'-10' w



- Weight capacity 20-25 lbs (up to 8 or possibly 10 panels)
- Hang each with 2 [sign/drapery/"S" hooks](#) or zip tie loops. [How to attach "S" hooks to panels](#) [1:55]
- A zip tie here or there (top, bottom, or sides) may be helpful to straighten any irregularities.
- The segmented horizontal bar is stiff enough for up to 2 panels, or 3 with a little extra help from zip ties to flatten any puckers.
 - **To hang as many as 3-5 pairs of panels (back-to-back):** buy a simple piece of \$10 [metal conduit](#) at any hardware store and use at 10 ft (5 or 10 panels) or 8 ft (4 or 8 panels) or 6 ft (3 or 6 panels). If you don't have time to drill 2 holes to slide over the stand's mounting screw & wingnut, lash the conduit on very securely with wire. Our stand legs with a 10-ft conduit were strong enough to support up to 5 panels (one-sided viewing) or 5 pairs of panels for double-sided viewing.
- **Safety: The tented legs can be a trip-hazard.**
 - You do NOT want people falling and hurting themselves while taking down all the panels.
 - Solutions may include taping the floor with bright-colored tape or propping bags of Soul Boxes, sandbags, or cloths around the legs.

- This is an alternative model we have not tried.




If your display will not be flat against a wall, consider connecting 2-legged structures to make a "V" or "U" shape footprint for additional stability. Or use a 4-legged "pipe & drape" tent structure (without the drape).

Situation 3 Pipe and Drape structures

(INDOORS or OUTDOORS)

- [Overview of pipe & drape](#) [first 20 sec]
- Pipe and drape structures can be rented by the day/week through party stores or event equipment rentals
- 10' x 10' party tents (as used by artists at outdoor art fairs) can be used.
- Panels can be hung back-to-back
- Hang on parallel sides for a walk-through experience or on three sides for a U-shaped alcove



Additional Accessories

Portable Garment Rack (click for source)

- Adjustable height & width
- Horizontal bar from 36" to 60" w, plenty for 2 panels side-by-side or a combination of sign(s)/panel(s).

Adjustable garment racks can hold panels only or a combination of signs and panels, double- or single-sided.

PVC stand (DIY: floor model with 24" logo banner.....or tabletop model)

PVC pipe and connectors are readily available at hardware stores.



Table(s) (x1 or 2) and Folding Chairs (x4-6)

- Pile or spread out Soul Boxes made during event
- Seating for volunteers and/or visitors to sit and fold Soul Boxes



Table Coverings

- Fabric (such as stretch covers for [6-ft](#) or [8-ft](#) tables) or
- Plastic [disposable](#)

Box-making materials

Glue sticks (1 or 2) for collage, or if visitors come with a photograph to attach

Scissors (1 or 2 to cut paper and to cut zip ties)

Paper cut to 8.5" x 8.5"

Markers (5 or more, colors optional)
